Dr. Lloyd Webb is a Professor of Public Health in the Graduate Public Health Program at the College of Veterinary Medicine (CVM) at Tuskegee University, Tuskegee, Alabama, USA where he earned his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) degree in 1978 from the School of Veterinary Medicine, Tuskegee University. He is also a 1984 public health graduate from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Hygiene and Public Health. Since then, he has championed the cause of public health serving in various public health coordinating roles in academia and the public sector. He returned to Tuskegee University, his Alma Mater in 2011 to direct and administer the Graduate Public Health Program from its inception at the CVM in 2011 until August 2016. He has taught and mentored graduate students who have pursued and continue to pursue degrees leading to the Master of Science in Public Health (MSPH) and the Master of Public Health (MPH). Prior to his return to Tuskegee University, he served for ten years as the Caribbean Regional Adviser on Veterinary Public Health to the Pan American Health Organization/World Health Organization, advising English-speaking Caribbean governments on important public health matters of significance to Ministries of Agriculture and Health; training veterinarians, public health officers and agricultural officers in several areas of discipline including the International Health Regulations (2005); managing the change process for the modernization of the national legislative framework for agricultural health and food safety in the Caribbean with funding from the United States Agency for International Development (USAID); and advocating for the control of emerging and re-emerging zoonotic diseases, and the application of the One-Health concept. He also assisted several countries in the formulation of policies and plans to guide their public health programs and inspection services. During the period 2014 – 2015, he served as the Interim Associate Dean for the College of Veterinary Medicine at Tuskegee University. Before joining the PAHO/WHO as an international servant and later returning to Tuskegee University as a faculty member in 2011, he was a tenured faculty member at the School of Veterinary Medicine, Faculty of Medical Sciences at the St Augustine Campus of the University of the West Indies (UWI) in his native country, Trinidad and Tobago, where he taught first level entry veterinarians and graduate students at the Faculty of Agriculture. In July 2013, Dr. Webb received the Honorary Achievement Award from the American Veterinary Epidemiology Society for distinguished service and contribution to the field of public health. He has enjoyed a distinguished career in collaborating on projects and research in the field of food hygiene, public health, epidemiology and zoonotic diseases. Currently he is engaged in working with underserved communities to address public health issues through biomedical research and public health linkages using the One Health and Global Health approaches, and remains deeply passionate about engaging public health graduates and

veterinary students in community outreach activities, seeking out research and community development opportunities that could be valuable to community development and sustainability.
